

COURT CEREMONY

The new Livery year commenced on Saturday, 1st, April 2023 at an Installation Court, held in the magnificent surroundings of Cardiff City Hall.



The Installation Court, attended by the incoming officers, 22 other members of Court including 11 Past Masters, Chaplain, and more than 50 guests saw the formal installation of **Major John Charles**, **TD***, **DL**, as the Master for 2023-24 along with **Mrs Agnes Xavier-Phillips JP DL** as Senior Warden and **Mr Henry Gilbert** as Junior Warden.







The Court also recognised the appointment of **Mr Stuart Castledine as Deputy Master** (effectively the Immediate Past Master) for the coming year.

The Beadle, **Liveryman Bob Foster** and the **Acting Clerk, Liveryman Charles Slatter** were also present and ensured the smooth running of the event.

Upon closure of the Court the officers and a number of guests processed to a service of celebration at St. John's Church in the heart of Cardiff and recessed to the City Hall.



INSTALLATION SERVICE AT ST. JOHN'S CHURCH 2023

The Admissions Court was followed by the Installation Service. Although it had rained heavily the previous day and during Saturday morning, by the afternoon it had dried up and the sun shone so we were able to process comfortably from the City Hall to St John's Church. The service was conducted by the Chaplain, **The Reverend Canon Sarah Jones**. In her address Sarah, emphasised the diversity of people, echoing the reading from 1st Corinthians chosen and read by the Master.



Sarah pointed out the great diversity of experience and knowledge to be found in the Worshipful Livery Company of Wales and yet Liverymen work together to encourage and promote the study of Arts, Sciences and Technology in the young people of Wales. The service was especially significant to the Liverymen as one of the hymns used words written by Liveryman **Reverend Paul Bigmore** to the Tune Rachie (I bob un sydd ffyddlon) and the closing Hymn, Guide me, O Thou Great Jehovah, was written by the great-uncle of **PM Geoff Hughes**. A Retiring Collection was taken to further the work of St. John's Church for the homeless and needy in Cardiff.





Following a pleasant short walk back from St. John The Baptist's Church, Liverymen and our guests received their personal copies of the Installation Banquet Programme from the Assistant Clerk **Angela Parry MBE** as they processed up the grand staircase in the City Hall to be received at the top by our new Master, **Major John Charles TD DL**, our Senior Warden, **Mrs Agnes Xavier-Phillips JP DL**, and our Junior Warden, **Mr Henry Gilbert**.

After Dinner we sang Grace and offered the Loyal Toasts and joined in the anthems

Mr Mike Foy OBE, the Past President of The Chartered Institute of Building, responded on behalf of the Guests.
