

WLCoW Achievement Award Winner 2021



Last year Prince William launched Homewards, a five-year plan to help address issues related to homelessness in the UK.

The Prince of Wales has called for the narrative around homelessness to change, and said the issues should be humanised in order to "lose the stigma". He said he wanted to act as a "disruptor" and "say to you all to think differently, outside the box because this is unique what you're doing".

Prince William was speaking during a meeting with women who have experienced homelessness, in Newport Mon.

He was joined by Sabrina Cohen-Hatton, who is chief fire officer at West Sussex Fire & Rescue Service and was previously homeless in Newport.

Sabrina was WLCow Achievement Award winner in 2021. She said the prince was focused on the "human impact of homelessness" and that she felt he was "quite moved" by the stories he heard.

The Homewards project operates in Newport, Aberdeen, Bournemouth, Christchurch & Poole, Lambeth, Northern Ireland and Sheffield, and aims to work across areas of society to end homelessness in the UK
